



Statement of Faith

Volunteers and staff who are interested in serving with us will share our fundamental beliefs set forth in this Statement of Faith. Hope Ranch For Women was founded on the truths and principles of the Bible. The Bible contains the principles for our daily lives and provides the foundation for our program. - I believe in one God, Creator of all things, holy, infinitely perfect, and eternally existing in a loving relationship of three equally divine Persons: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
- I believe that God has spoken in the Scriptures, both Old and New Testaments, through the words of human authors. These written words, the Bible, inspired by the Holy Spirit is without error.
- I believe that God created Adam and Eve in His image, but they sinned when tempted by Satan. In union with Adam, human beings are sinners by nature and by choice, alienated from God, and under His wrath.
- I believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God. Through His perfect life and sacrificial death, He atoned for the sins of the world. This atonement is a gift to all who will trust in Jesus' death alone for complete payment for their sins. Through His resurrection, He gives us the ability to walk in authority over the enemy.
- I believe that the Holy Spirit, in all that He does, glorifies the Lord Jesus Christ and the Father. He convicts the world of its guilt. He is the life giver, and in Him sinners are baptized into union with Christ and adopted as heirs in the family of God. He also indwells, illuminates, guides, equips and empowers believers for Christ-like living and service in the Kingdom of God.
